**POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT**

**COUNSELING FACULTY – SCHOOL COUNSELING EMPHASIS.** The faculty of the Counseling and Educational Psychology Department in the School of Education at Indiana University Bloomington announces the opening of a tenure-track assistant professor position to begin fall 2016. The successful candidate will have identified and initiated a research program with the potential for external funding. In addition, the candidate will have a defined area of interest in teaching, and will have shown evidence of, or potential for, high quality teaching. This person will join the faculty of a master's program in mental health and school counseling (CACREP-accredited) and a PhD program in counseling psychology (APA-accredited). In addition to teaching undergraduate and graduate level courses, this person is expected to supervise students' research and practica, and to provide service to the department, school, and university.

**QUALIFICATIONS.** Earned doctorate from a counselor education or counseling psychology program with appropriate program accreditation, and expertise in school counseling. Additionally, the following qualifications are desired: (a) expertise in African American psychology, health psychology, women's issues, interpersonal skills training, multicultural counseling, or cognitive and personality assessments; (b) success or strong potential for seeking external research funding; (c) licensure or eligibility for licensure as a counselor or psychologist; and (d) interest in and potential for program leadership.

**APPLICATION PROCESS.** Review of applications will begin on October 1, 2015, and will continue until the position is filled.
